Position & Responsibilities

Role Summary

The Criminal Legal Advocate is responsible for attending in-custody arraignments in Stillwater or St. Paul and relays information about criminal domestic assault cases to the clients involved.

Impact & Benefits

- Assist clients in navigating the court process, which can be confusing and intimidating
- Provide information and support, helping clients explore their legal options
- Learn about legal issues concerning domestic violence and the criminal court process
- Gain practical experience and learn about the vital role of the legal department in a nonprofit organization.

Position Responsibilities

- Attend court hearings and communicate input to the judge/ prosecutor handling the cases
- Meet with clients in court if they are present
- Document outcomes of the court appearances and complete all necessary follow-up, including relaying information to the client as necessary
- Ability to determine professional boundaries on a legal scale, including maintaining confidentiality and discerning needed information
- Provide general support and relay information to the client throughout the legal process

Qualifications & Expectations

Position Qualifications

- Working knowledge of court system and legal terminology
- Ability and willingness to listen actively and respond appropriately to the needs of clients
- Ability to work with diverse teams and clients to foster a culturally inclusive environment
- Must have own transportation

Time Commitment & Availability

- 12 hours a week for a minimum of 6 months preferred
- Weekday, daytime availability required

- Supervision provided by the Legal Services Team
