Position & Responsibilities

Role Summary

The Safety Project Intern assists Tubman's Safety Project staff in providing free representation for low income, domestic violence victims seeking attorneys for Orders for Protection and providing assistance for staff with administrative tasks, data entry, and communications.

- Help clients explore their legal options and provide information and support
- Learn about legal issues concerning domestic violence and the civil court process
- Gain experience and learn about the vital role of the legal department in a non-profit organization

Position Responsibilities

- Assist staff with client intake and support, including client evaluations and providing referrals to clients for other Tubman and community resources
- Provide administrative support including completing attorney thank-you letters, database entry for grant reporting purposes, coordinating attorney trainings, recognitions, and other events
- Adhere to agency guidelines regarding professional boundaries, ethics, and confidentiality
